Market Report

The season is in full swing, and your almonds are pouring into our facility. Last week's excessive heat wave was brutal for your harvesting process and our plant workers. Thankfully, we now have beautiful temperatures; the cooler air is welcomed. (And we heard a prediction of rain for this weekend.) The weather is constantly changing.

Speaking of change, let's direct this conversation to what's happening in the almond market. California handlers shipped 10% MORE last month over August 2021 (which was a record setting month). This is exciting news because it means product is moving. Where did it ship? Spain, China, United Arab Emirates, Turkey, and Morocco all increased their shipments, collectively receiving 60.4 million pounds. Overall, nearly 163 million pounds were exported (15% more than August 2021 & 45% more than July 2022). Domestic sales fell slightly behind August 2021; 65.5 million pounds shipped which equates to 1.7% less than twelve months ago BUT 14% more than July 2022. Most of the almonds that shipped during the month of August came from the 2021 crop.

So, what about the 2022 crop? As of August 31, receipts are behind August 2021 by 15%. So far, grower inspection reports from the south show a 0-10% decrease, local central valley receipts are 10-20% behind last year, and, sadly, northern growers are 35-50% under last year's crop. Time will determine if the crop appears short because harvesting is

running late, if the overall crop tonnage is down, or if both concepts are happening simultaneously. Also, moisture is weight. The average moisture for 2021 crop was 4.25%. So far this year, the average moisture is 3.9%. Dry kernels automatically reduce tonnage.

The uncertainty of the crop size concerns both handlers and customers. Handlers are slow to sell new crop nonpareils (specifically large kernels) until the majority of the variety has been processed. This hesitation tends to make customers a bit antsy. For now, handlers who have little 2021 crop carry-in have a *BIT* more control in the driver-seat regarding 2022 crop prices.

Current sales show prices are all over the board. Handlers who have a large carry-in need to offer softened prices, while handlers who are moving mostly new crop can price almonds about 10 cents higher. We are thrilled to state that Valley Harvest Nut has less than four percent remaining to sell of the 2021 crop. This means we get to sit in the driver seat!

We feel blessed. Our growers trustingly rely on us to work diligently on their behalf promoting their almond harvest, our employees are faithful to produce high quality products, and our customers crave Valley Harvest Nut almonds in their products. We are blessed and we thank each of you for giving us the opportunity to serve you.
