Market Report

January was a strong month for shipping across the water. Overseas buyers came to life, relished in the low prices and appreciated a better exchange rate. The result? They bought more almonds this January than any other January; statistics show that almost 30% more almonds shipped. They bought, so California shipped. That makes the total industry shipping numbers ahead of last year by 2.6%!!! Simply an incredible miracle.

....Now the rest of the story!

Valley Harvest has always prided ourselves in that we aren't an export company and we choose to sell domestically. We keep your almonds on this side of the water. That has always proved to be the best tactic for our business and has given our growers better returns than most handlers. However, this month, while the export market went bonkers, the domestic market in January went haywire. The grocery store high prices, interest rates increasing in hopes to stop inflation, residue from the Covid lockdown, overall

inflation in most financial areas caused domestic shipments to lag behind last month and, therefore, the industry is behind last year by 7% for domestic shipments. Valley Harvest is equal to the industry. However, between February 1st and 15th, we shipped 85% of the entire January activity. Also, on the upside, prices are leaning towards an increase rather than decrease. Overall, pricing decreased \$0.26 per sold pound since September. We are definitely ready for the upside. It may take a month to see that, but we trust the increase will keep coming.

On the farming side, we have been blessed with abundant rain, a fantastic snowpack, and I just heard that farmers will receive an average abundant year of irrigation water. The bloom is opening up quickly, spray rigs are gearing up, and the bees are working. Let's pray the predicted rain next week doesn't play havoc with the blossoms! We need the rain but we also need the blossoms!

The joys and struggles of farming continue....
