<u>Market Report</u>

Harvest is now at the very tail end. We received the last of the new crop YESTERDAY AFTERNOON, Valley Harvest Nut has officially closed the Incoming department.

It has been a busy drying year. Even though we are waiting for more rain to wet the dry fields, the few showers during harvest led to about 12% of all incoming lots needing to be dried. The huge red Peerless wagons sit under the drying canopy many years just collecting dust. But when those wagons are needed, they are a blessing to save almond kernels from molding and possibly losing an entire crop. This would be NO BUENO!

Shipping on the export market has been robust with numbers exceeding last year. We, at Valley Harvest, work with the domestic market and our plant has been extremely busy keeping up with the domestic demand. Our shipping is similar to past years at this point. Our challenge has been to keep up with the requests. Our technician who controls the EVO machine (electronic eye sorter) has had



to slow the 'output' to be able to remove the increased inedible kernels and the table sorting lines are running much slower to locate all the pinhole. There-

fore, we have been working ten-hour days and many Saturdays so that we can tell the customers, "sure, we can have that for you!"

Regarding pricing, we believe better days are coming. The total incoming crop will fall below the estimate of 2.6 billion. With the high inedible count challenging the end-product quality, combined with the increase in export shipments, the anticipation of increased pricing, or at least stable pricing, remains strong. We will watch as the new year approaches.
