## <u> Market Report</u>

NASS Objective Forecast is a

2.8 Billion Pound 2024 Almond Crop

If you recall, the Subjective Estimate on 5/10/24 was 3 billion pounds. This time, the actual tree count revealed a smaller estimate than the subjective phone call estimate. The new number of 2.8 billion aligns with the comments from our growers who felt like there wasn't 3 billion pounds of almonds on the trees. Of course, it is around this time next year (2025) that we will have the actual harvested number.

June's industry shipping numbers were up again but not quite as much as the previous two months. Valley Harvest shipping numbers are up significantly for the last two months. With all the good movement in the industry, we increased prices for manufactured and whole almonds <a href="#">AND</a> buyers are still placing orders (with a bit of grumbling under their breath).

This current estimate of 2.8 billion should stabilize and increase pricing even more. The most prevalent comment to our buyers is "I'm sorry, the product is sold out." Buyers, scurrying to cover their needs, most often take what is still

remaining. Our annual goal is sell all but 600,000 pounds so we can carry-in product to manufacture and sell while we wait for the later varieties to be harvested. We are on target to meet this goal.

Right now, the main emphasis for our growers is timing of your irrigations because of the record-high temperatures. Also, your spray program is eminent at this time to control navel orange worm, mites, and other pests during hull split. We trust the industry does not repeat the excessive inedible count that existed last year. Our Valley Harvest inedible requirement for the annual Almond Board Inedible Disposition is up 250% more than last year. This disposition takes place for our facility in August of each year. The more we are required to dispose of, the less we have to sell for you. Clean and healthy orchards are important and put more cash in your pockets
